IMPORTANT TRANSPORTATION NOTES:

Lake Placid is located in the Adirondack Mountains of Northern New York. As Lake Placid is some distance from major international airports, you should avoid arranging for ground transportation on your arrival at the airport. Limousine service, while available, is expensive. It is recommended that you consider these options in making your travel arrangements. The conference is arranging for travel from the Albany, New York Airport to the conference, on a reservation basis only.

Transportation options:

1. Via Albany, New York airport. The Albany airport is 140 miles from Lake Placid. The conference has arranged for a scheduled bus service from the Albany Airport directly to the conference hotel. This service will be provided Saturday for flights arriving as late as 10pm, and Sunday September 12, for flights arriving as late as 3:30pm. Return service will be provided Wednesday September 15 for flights leaving as early as 3pm, and Thursday morning, September 16. **ADVANCE REGISTRATION FOR THIS SERVICE IS REQUIRED.** The actual number and times of the bus service will depend on demand. If you register for this service, please send flight numbers and times as soon as they are known.

2. Through Dorval Airport, Montreal Quebec, Canada. Dorval is 120 miles from Lake Placid. The best way to travel from Montreal to Lake Placid is by rental car. Train service is available, through Canada's Via Rail and the US Amtrak, check with the conference organizers for details, or check directly with the rail lines.
3. Through Saranac Lake Airport: The Saranac Lake Airport is 20 miles from Lake Placid and is served by a commuter airline associated with Continental Airlines. The conference will operate a free shuttle between the Saranac Lake airport and the conference hotel. For those arriving in Saranac Lake, please advise conference organizers in advance to ensure prompt service.
4. Burlington, Vermont. The Burlington airport is 60 miles from Lake Placid, if you take the Charlotte-Essex ferry across Lake Champlain. Rental cars are available at the airport. See <http://www.ferries.com/> for the ferry schedule.
5. Lake Placid is served by Adirondack Trailways bus service, which originates in New York City and stops in Albany. Contact the conference chair for further information, or see <http://www.escapemaker.com/adirondacktrailways/> for the bus schedule.

Registration notes:

1. Full Conference Registration includes: Sunday evening reception, all technical sessions and exhibits, all breaks, Monday and Tuesday lunches, the conference banquet, the conference tour, and one copy of the conference proceedings (CD).
2. Student registration includes the Sunday reception, breakfasts, breaks and lunches, and the conference CD. The banquet and tour are available to students for the extra fee.
3. The conference tutorial is "Power Quality and DG Integration- IEEE 1547 and Beyond," and is presented by EPRI-PEAC and Nova Energy Specialists. The tutorial will take place from 1pm to 5pm on Sunday September 12, and the tutorial fee includes the course materials. Conference registration is required in order to register for the tutorial.
4. The Sunday hiking outing is an all day event, and includes a pack lunch. Please bring appropriate shoes and clothing for this outing, plus a small pack. Inclement weather will cancel the outing. The scheduled hike will require an intermediate level of effort—some recent hiking experience is recommended.
5. The Sunday canoe outing will take place at a selected location along the Saranac Lake/River system, and includes a sack lunch and all gear. The outing will be suitable for beginning paddlers. Inclement weather will cancel the outing. Ability to swim is required. Please bring shoes that can get wet. This outing is limited to 12 participants.
6. The boat tour is an afternoon event on Sunday September 12. Cruise the pristine waters of Lake Placid in an enclosed, turn-of-the-century watercraft. The narrated tour travels 16 miles on one of the world's most beautiful lakes. See and hear about the stately manors situated along the shore, Adirondack wildlife, and

Whiteface Mountain, site of the alpine events during the 1980 Winter Olympic Games.

7. Spouse/Companion Registration: The spouse/companion registration includes the Sunday evening reception and the morning continental breakfasts. Tickets to the banquet, lunches, and tour and be available and purchased separately.
